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NEW CREATION 1 – THE FUTURE MATTERS

11:1,13-16, 2 Corinthians 4:16-5:8, 1 Corinthians 15:19, Philippians 1:21)

INTRO - AIMS FOR THE WEEKEND

To see how important the new creation is in the Bible	The solution <u>we</u> intuitively think
To see how thrilling the new creation is	God <u>reveals</u> the solution that will work
To see that it's so thrilling that we build our entire lives around it	God <u>accomplishes</u> the solution that will work (Heb 9:28)
HOW THE BIBLE SHOWS THE NEW CREATION IS KEY The new creation is very big in the NT	I.e. the new creation is <u>essential</u> to God's plan to reverse the Fall, just as essential as the cross
It gets mentioned a lot in the NT	
	WHY DOES GOD DO IT THIS WAY?Not because God made a mistake (Deuteronomy 31:16-18)
• The NT's statements about it are very strong (e.g. John 18:36, Mark 8:34-38, Hebrews	

BIG SUMMARY – WHOLE BIBLE

• God does things the way we intuitively think is right to teach <u>us</u> that a solution in this

- It's not easy to persuade us that what we are hearing in the echo chamber of this

• The problem: 2 parts

world won't work

world is a lie

GOD'S SOLUTION REVEALED
God reveals his <u>real</u> solution to the fall as he ends the "this world" part of his plan
Many important truths revealed at this point of the story for the first time
 E.g. a king who will bring perfect peace (Is 9: 6-7) and a sacrifice who will fully deal with sin (Is 53:4-6, 1:10-14)
• And a new creation in which God will solve the futility of this fallen world (Is 65:17-25, Is 25:6-8)
All these promises come as a package – fully forgiven people with a perfect king get a new perfect world as the only place they can properly experience God's promised blessings
God's plan shifts focus to a new creation because <u>only</u> there can the problems of this fallen world be properly dealt with
In 2s & 3s, discuss how you feel about God solving the problems of this fallen world in this radical manner

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 Rebellion is dealt with at Jesus' first coming & the curse at his second – God's rescue is only complete when Jesus returns (Rev 21:1-4, 22:1-4)

 So the new creation is the goal of all God is doing, the cross is that means to achieve this 	One of the main points of Ecclesiastes is that life in this world is futile
	- Because everyone dies (Eccl 2:12-17)
	 And we accomplish no lasting change (Eccl 1:2-4,9,14-15)
The new creation is vital to the Bible main themes	 And the blessings of this world are a disappointment (Eccl 2:4-11)
 One of the most important themes is <u>God making promises</u> & then fulfilling them E.g. to Abraham in Genesis 12 	 Solomon doesn't know if anything more than this world exists (Eccl 3:19-21)
- And to David	The Wisdom literature begins the shift from a focus on this world to something else by showing that this world cannot ultimately satisfy
Another of the Bible's biggest themes is <u>God rescuing His people</u>	• God gives multiple examples of the problems with this world at this point in the stor e.g. in Isaiah, rescue from one geopolitical crisis simply sets up the next one – (Is 7:14 17, 8:7-10, 36:1-2, 37:33-37, 39:5-7)
– But the key to rescue is what we are rescued <u>for</u>	
	All this draws a line under the story's focus on this world and begins to set up for what God will do next

NEW CREATION 4 – WHY THE FUTURE MATTERS

Why is the new creation big in the NT, but not early on in the OT?

No explicit mention until around the end of the nation of Israel at the exile
• Not arbitrary – this shift from this world to the new creation at this time is deliberate
This shift happens in the middle part of the OT where the story of salvation forward in several crucial ways
THE DOOD EM MADE OF EAD
THE PROBLEM MADE CLEAR The first part of this shift happens in the wisdom literature
Wisdom becomes important in the time of Solomon who was king when Israel was at her most successful and most blessed
 The promises God had made to Abraham and the good things he had offered Israel through Moses had apparently all been fulfilled
Ecclesiastes is an example of how these books are beginning the process of shifting the focus of what God is doing from this world to a new creation

 In the rescue that matters, Jesus' rescue of us, what we are rescued <u>for</u> is the new creation (e.g. John 14:1-3)

So the new creation is just as important as the cross, the means of getting there. To focus on one and not the other is to focus on only half the story

The NT attitude to the new creation (Rev 22:20)

In 2s & 3s, how do you feel about the new creation, <u>honestly</u> – excited, wanting to be there, disinterested & rarely thinking about it, hoping it doesn't come too soon because you have so much you want to do before Jesus returns, angry that God is more concerned with a new creation than this one, etc? Why?

WHAT IS THE NEW CREATION & WHY IT'S GREAT

Most Christians don't understand what the new creation will be like

• New creation is a <u>creation</u>, like this one but better (Is 25:6-8, 60:17-22, 1 Cor 15:42-49, 2 Peter 3:13)

 The highlight will be that we will be with God & Jesus & relate to them perfectly (Rev 21:1-4, 22:1-5) E.g. use Bible passages to help us imagine life in the new creation (be bold poetry, 1 Cor 2:9) Summary: we're in a propaganda war and we're losing for one reason only – we spall our time living in the enemy's echo chamber & listening to his propaganda 	v
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We don't understand what the new creation is like because many of the descriptions of it are in the OT prophets and also because the descriptions are poetic, meant to fire our imaginations	pend
 Another way to change our mindset is to begin investing in the new creation (Mt 21) 	6:19-
• We need more than information about the new creation, we need to meditate on it so our imaginations are captured by it Final thing: change is gradual – whether in a negative & positive direction	
Spend a few minutes on our own or in 2s or 3s thinking about 20 things you are looking forward to in the new creation in the light of what we have been thinking about (tip –

HOW CAN WE BECOME THIS SORT OF PERSON?

How can we get this sort of attitude and desire?	WHERE ARE WE IN THE STORY?
	The first coming of Jesus was the beginning of the end, but all God intends will only be fully accomplished with Jesus' second coming
 If we <u>really</u> get that something is great, our attitude to it changes and everything else changes 	We're in the overlap of the ages
How do we really understand the new creation, it's importance & how wonderful it is? – both hard and easy	
<u>Hard</u> because the world works hard to persuade us this world is the thing that really matters	
 We are in the middle of a propaganda war – this world is an echo chamber filled with the idea that nothing matters apart from this world 	• We are like Israel in the desert in the Exodus (e.g. Heb 3:15-4:1, 4:6-11)
 This is fake news & misinformation 	NT focuses so much on the new creation because Jesus could return at any point to bring it in fully
	 With OT promises must ask <u>when</u> they're for and <u>where</u> (e.g. 1 Peter 1:3-5)

NEW CREATION 2 – WHAT MATTERS IN LIGHT OF FUTURE

WHAT SHOULD WE EXPECT OF LIFE NOW?

	e are strangers and exiles here on earth (Heb 11:13), we belong to the new creation (Phil 20-21)
•	This means we should expect things often to be hard here on earth since this is not our home (e.g. Mk 8:34-38)
	 We have a journey to finish as we head home, just like Israel in the desert and a job to do (e.g. Phil 1:21-25)
•	There are blessings now, but fewer than we'd expect
•	Most of the blessings God gives us now are to help us keep going to the end
	- There is one blessing is a foretaste of the new creation – our relationship with God

All this is exemplified in Jesus who suffered in this world but is glorified in the new

creation (Heb 12:1-4)

• So the second way we lay up treasure in heaven is by growing Jesus' church, regardless of the cost

Christians throughout history have lived on earth in this radical way

- Jim Elliot 'He is no fool who gives up what he cannot keep to gain what he cannot lose'
- Key is the <u>desire</u> to be in the new creation with Jesus and the <u>attitude</u> that the best use of our lives here is to win & build up people who will be in the new creation
 - This will result in all sorts of different actions depending on your situation and circumstances

On your own, or in 2s & 3s, think about:

• If you really did think the new creation is infinitely more important than this one & the whole point of life now is to win & build Christians, what could you do with the situation, opportunities, personality & gifts God has given <u>you</u>? Be specific

N.B. again don't think about how hard it will be to get that attitude & desire

 So, laying up treasure in heaven means <u>not</u> seeking the things of this world (Mt 6:19- 20,24) 	In 2s & 3s discuss what you think of the idea that you are strangers here on earth – Excited? Terrified? Unhappy? Other?
On your own or in 2s or 3s, think about: What things of this world do you spend your time, energy & mental capacity seeking? What it would look like for you not to set your mind on earthly things but rather really want to be with Jesus in the new creation? – e.g. instead of daydreaming about a nice house here we could daydream about our new creation home N.B. don't think about how hard it will be to change, we'll come to this later	HOW SHOULD WE LIVE NOW? 1. Make sure we get to the new creation (1 Cor 15:19)
To live is Christ Explained in v22 and vv24,25 Labouring to help others in their faith, in every situation and joyfully (Phil 1:12-14, 15-18)	• Don't be seduced by the world (Num 11:4-6)
• Unpacked in chapter 2 (Phil 2:4-11, 2:29-30)	 Don't give up because of hardship now (2 Cor 4:16–18) – all sorts of things may happen to us while we wait (Heb 11:32-40, Luke 21:16-19)
	2. Lay-up treasure in heaven, i.e. invest in things that will last (Mt 6:19-21)
	The Bible tells us what will last
 Key is Paul's & Timothy's & Epaphroditus' attitudes & passions – they were concerned for Jesus' interests, not their own 	 God's church and the ministry that builds it will last (1 Cor 3:9-15)

– Love & holiness also last (1 Cor 13:8-10, 2 Peter 3:11-13) – connected to church	NEW CREATION 3 – LIVING IN THE LIGHT OF WHAT MATTERS 2 questions for this session
 Nothing else will last (Rev 21:1, 1 Cor 15:42-44, 50-53) 	
3. Don't lay-up treasure on earth (Mt 6:19-21)	 FIRST, WHAT IS INVOLVED IN LAYING UP TREASURE IN HEAVEN, NOT ON EARTH? Philippians speaks about living as citizens of heaven while on earth, similar to laying up treasure in heaven (Phil 1:27 [see footnote], 3:20-21, 3:17)
These will pass away	What it means for Paul to live as a citizen of heaven while on earth (Phil 1:21-25)
– But don't despise the good things of this world	 To die is gain Explained in1:23b – to die & be with Jesus is much better Unpacked in chapter 3 (Phil 3:11-17)
 We needn't be too concerned with what happens to this world, but this does NOT mean we trash it 	 Without this mindset we end up as enemies of Christ's cross, headed for destruction (Phil 3:18-19)
In your groups, think about the following questions:	 Laying up treasure on earth leads in the end to sacrificing our Christian lives
 In what ways would your lives look different if you really believed that God is focusing on a new creation & that is where we belong, even now? – don't just think evangelism What might it mean for you to lay up treasure in heaven? In what ways are you in danger of storing up treasure on earth? 	The damage is done gradually
